

The beauty of Spinneybeck leather combined with the dimension and texture of weaving create truly unique covering for upholstery and architectural applications, such as wall panels. Leatherweave is produced using various leather styles resulting in an elegant, unusual and sophisticated product.

In-Stock Program

Spinneybeck offers two Leatherweave programs. The In-Stock program features 23 styles in an extensive color palette. Single colors are available in various textures including pearlized, sueded and four patent leathers. The standard width is 38 inches and the leather strips are 5 mm. The maximum length for Leatherweave is 80 linear feet per roll. The collection also includes three exclusive patterns designed by noted textile designer Elizabeth Whelan. These designs combine multiple leather styles and colors. Two patterns utilize the standard 5 mm strips of leather and one pattern achieves its unique appearance with 3 mm strips and a repeat. All weaves ship with a cotton backer which is applied for stability. The minimum order quantity for In-Stock Leatherweave is 18 square feet.

Custom Program

Any of Spinneybeck's leather styles may be used to create Custom Leatherweave patterns. Woven patterns may include up to four leather colors and a combination of textures is also possible. The standard Leatherweave width is 36 inches, although it can be produced in widths from 27 inches to 39 inches in half-inch increments. The standard strip width is 5mm and other width strips can be accommodated. The maximum length of Custom Leatherweave is 80 linear feet per roll. A cotton backer in black or natural is available upon request. There is no additional charge for the cotton backer.

Once the leathers are selected for a Custom Leatherweave, the leather is shipped to Italy to be woven. A minimum quantity of 18 square feet is required for a custom order. Since this is a custom product, as a safeguard the tannery will produce an overrun of 5%–10% to guarantee no shortages. The lead-time for Custom Leatherweave is 6–8 weeks.
